Purpose of the CPR Course

Cardiac arrest can happen anywhere, and the actions taken in the first few minutes are critical. This course gives you the skills and confidence to perform CPR and operate an AED in accordance with Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines, keeping a casualty alive until emergency services arrive.

The target learner for this course includes those who require CPR competency for work or leisure activities. This includes, but is not limited to, workers required to hold a current CPR qualification as part of their role or industry obligations, volunteers in community and sporting organisations, parents and carers, and individuals seeking a nationally recognised CPR qualification for personal or professional development

Course Description

This course describes the skills and knowledge required to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

This course applies to all persons who may be required to provide CPR, in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.

This course provides the practical skills and the theory required to provide both a CPR response, and defibrillation to someone in cardiac arrest.

CPR Course covers:

- Recognise and assess an emergency situation.
- Ensure safety for self, bystanders, and casualty.
- Assess the casualty and recognise the need for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).
- Seek assistance from emergency services.
- Perform CPR in accordance with the ARC guidelines.
- Display respectful behaviour towards casualty.
- Operate an automated external defibrillator (AED) according to manufacturers' instructions.
- Accurately convey incident details to emergency services.
- Report details of incident in line with appropriate workplace or site procedures.
- Maintain privacy and confidentiality of information in line with statutory or organisational policies.

- Recognise the possible psychological impacts on self and other rescuers and seek help when required.
- Contribute to a review of the first aid response as required.

Mode of Delivery

Online learning and knowledge assessment plus face-to-face classroom training and assessment.

Assessment Summary

The assessment in support of the unit of competency requires the learner to complete a written knowledge assessment and each candidate to demonstrate skills in an environment that provides realistic in-depth, scenarios and simulations to assess candidates' skills and knowledge.

The learner must answer all the written knowledge questions correctly. There is the opportunity for this knowledge assessment to be conducted verbally if the learner requires this level of support.

The practical assessment is conducted under controlled conditions in a classroom. Evidence of the ability to complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit in the context of the workplace or community setting.

National Recognition

Upon successful completion of all training and assessment requirements, learners will be issued with a Statement of Attainment for the following nationally recognised unit of competency:

HLTAID009 – Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation

This unit of competency is nationally recognised and provides individuals with a valuable outcome that is recognised throughout Australia.

Course Duration and Location

This is a blended course with self-paced online learning and face-to-face training. Before attending the face-to-face training, learners will need to complete their e-Learning and knowledge assessment. This can be done in one sitting or over several sessions.

Depending on the learner's prior knowledge and pace, they should allow up to 1 hour for e-Learning and Knowledge Assessment. The face-to-face training and practical assessment takes approximately 2 hours in a classroom environment.

Entry Requirements

Prospective learners must meet the following:

- Prospective learners must be at least 18 years of age at the time of enrolment.
- Applicants under 18 years of age are not eligible to enrol in Highlands Training Solutions courses.
- Prospective learners must possess basic digital skills and have access to a computer, tablet or smartphone with internet access to complete the online learning and knowledge assessment. Prior to commencing training, Highlands Training Solutions will undertake a Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital (LLND) skills review to determine whether the course is suitable for the prospective learner and to identify any reasonable support that may assist successful participation.
- Prospective learners must have sufficient language, literacy, numeracy and digital skills to access the online learning, read and interpret CPR information, complete assessment activities and communicate effectively in simulated emergency situations. Where the LLND skills review identifies that additional support may be required, Highlands Training Solutions will discuss reasonable support strategies with the participant, provided these do not compromise the requirements of the training product. If, following the review, Highlands Training Solutions determines that the participant is unlikely to successfully complete the course, even with reasonable support, the participant will be advised before enrolment proceeds.

Learners Confirm

- I confirm that I am 18 years of age or older and meet the entry requirements for this course.
- I understand that Highlands Training Solutions will review my Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital (LLND) skills prior to training to determine whether the course is suitable for me and to identify any reasonable support that may be required.
- I understand that participants must have the physical capacity to complete the practical assessment requirements for CPR, including kneeling on the floor and performing at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted CPR on an adult manikin placed on the floor, and at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted CPR on an infant manikin placed on a firm surface, in accordance with the requirements of the unit of competency. Learners who have concerns regarding their ability to meet these requirements should contact Highlands Training Solutions prior to enrolment to discuss their individual circumstances.
- I understand that photo identification is required to be sighted prior to course commencement.
- I understand that a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI) must be provided prior to the issuance of my Statement of Attainment. To create a USI or look up an existing one, visit usi.gov.au.
- I understand that a Statement of Attainment cannot be issued unless all assessment requirements and performance evidence requirements for the unit(s) of competency have been successfully demonstrated.

Recertification

The Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) provides the nationally recognised guidelines for resuscitation in Australia. In accordance with these guidelines, it is recommended that HLTAID009 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation be refreshed every twelve (12) months to maintain current skills and meet industry best practice.
